

Start from standing outside the old church tower...

What is the name for this local landmark?

It is the town's oldest surviving building, and has great value as a local landmark. The original 13th Century church stood on this site.

Who is the bust of in the churchyard?



Turn right and follow the pavement with the wall of the churchyard on your right hand side. Turn immediately before the road bridge. The bridge was open in 1940.

How old is it? _____ years old.

Continue along to the King's Head pub. The River Severn is Britain's longest river and runs from Plynlimon in Wales to it's estuary in the Bristol Channel. Turn right and notice on the wall three diamond shaped plaques that record flood water levels.

What are the years on these plaques?



Turn back down the street and stop by the King's Head. Look down over the wall to see the lower paved area, which is the site of the former swing bridge. Continue walking downstream then join Dunns Lane. Cross over the road and join the footpath that runs alongside Ye Olde Anchor Inn.

What animal can you see in the Upton in Bloom garden?

Turn left on to High Street. Ye Olde Anchor Inn building dates back over four centuries. Continue along the pavement to pass under the impressive porch of a hotel.

What is the hotel called?

Turn left on to Court Street. The group of buildings on the left was Upton's Workhouse. A workhouse was a place where those unable to support themselves were offered accommodation and employment. Continue along the alley, passing concrete bollards and past the back of the library.

Turn down the second alley on the right, opposite a long brick wall. Turn left to Upton Parish Church of St Peter and St Paul. This church replaced the original church in 1879.

Can you find the tomb of a crusader knight who died during the Wars of the Roses?

What was his name?

Turn right along Old Street. As you walk down the street, you will pass many shops, cafes and pubs. Can you find where the Old Post Office would have been? Turn left in to New Street and follow the road to the left hand turn. Here you will see the playground.

What type of transport can you see?

Retrace your steps back to New Street. To your left you will see the old Fire Station and an old chapel that is now used as a repair garage.

What can you see outside the garage?

P _____ P

Head back to the top of New Street and turn left along High Street towards the river, then turn left into Church Street. The Tudor Museum contains a fantastic collection of Upton artifacts and information about it's past.

Cross the road at the pedestrian crossing and pass under the bridge. At the Kings Head turn right and return to the Tourist Information Centre.
