



Travelling through our stunning area you will notice that, as well as the magnificent landscapes of the Malvern Hills and riverside idylls of Upton upon Severn and the Teme Valley, we are home to an abundance of farmland, vineyards and orchards.

The Malverns is studded with vineyards which benefit from the rich soil of the Severn Valley and the sunny slopes of the Malvern Hills. Orchards and hop fields fill the countryside meaning you are never far from a pint of real ale, cider or fresh pressed apple juice. Keep a look out for brands like The Hop Shed, Malvern Hills Brewery, Oldfields and Robinsons to name just a few.

Sample our amazing fresh produce at many local independent restaurants, pubs and cafés, or head direct to a local farm shop or farmers' market to stock your cupboards with seasonal groceries. The fertile landscape along the River Severn and the River Teme also provides great pastureland, benefiting locally-reared meats and dairy.

Local fine dining restaurants take advantage of this bounty of excellent produce. Green Michelin Starred restaurant Pensons, near Tenbury Wells, has a strong commitment to using local ingredients, growing many in its onsite kitchen

Head to Malvhina Fountain in Great Malvern to try Malvern spring water, keep an eye out in local hotels, shops, cafés and restaurants for Holy Well Spring Water - sourced from the original Well - first bottled in 1622.

WALK 'THE LAND OF HOPE & GLORY'

Take a stroll on the Malvern Hills during your stay and you will find yourself in good company. England's greatest composer
Sir Edward Elgar walked these paths and was inspired to Sir Edward Elgar walked these paths and was inspired to write his iconic tunes such as Land of Hope & Glory here. Many a literary genius, including J.R.R Tolkien, C.S Lewis, William Langland, Charles Dickens and Charles Darwin visited The Malverns and took musing walks on the many miles of footpaths that snake through some of England's most beautiful countryside. Enjoy a walk through the picturesque Teme Valley, discover the rare flora and fauna at Upton Ham (SSSI) alongside the River Severn, or ramble up to the top of the Malvern Hills.

HERITAGE & GARDENS

THE NIGHT SKY

As evening comes to The Malverns experience one of our spectacular sunsets from a prime spot on the Malvern Hills. After the sun has set the night sky gets its chance to shine, we have two Dark Sky Discovery Sites in the Malvern Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (in Golden Valley and Mathon), where, when weather conditions allow, the Milky Way can be seen with the naked eye.

MALVERN

Nestled between the eastern slopes of the magnificent Malvern Hills sits the town of Great Malvern. Rich in heritage, it has been recognised as a designated conservation area for its special architectural and historic interest. Browse the fantastic independent shops in Great Malvern, Malvern Link and Barnards Green: the three centres which make up the town of Malvern.

TENBURY WELLS

Tenbury Wells is a town on the River Teme bordering the counties of Worcestershire, Herefordshire, and Shropshire. The area surrounding the town is renowned for growing hops and cider apples and as such was affectionately referred to as 'my little town in the orchard' by Queen Victoria.

You can explore the town with the Hidden Tenbury QR Trail which brings Tenbury's rich history to life and takes in various sites, including the Pump Rooms, Tenbury Museum and St. Mary's Church.


UPTON UPON SEVERN

This picturesque riverside town is a lovely place to spend some time, renowned for its lively music festival calendar, there is a choice of different music genres throughout the year. Take a walk through the historic streets and along the River Severn to Upton Ham which is a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), or hire a self-drive boat from Severn Expeditions in Upton Marina to tour the river at your leisure.
